

PDHPE TASK 3

NOTES:

- Students are welcome to ask for a general content related explanation of the subject material. **Direct questions relating to this assessment task will not be addressed nor will practice attempts be marked.** Students are encouraged to make use of their peers in the proof reading of their work.
- Students need not write and memorise 12 answers. Learn the content related to the questions and make paragraph plans for your answers. Test yourself by selecting random questions and writing full answers in the time specified.
- The task details are being released during the holidays to allow students the option of starting early. If students choose not to do this, there is still adequate time once school resumes. The content for the final few questions will not be covered until the end of week 1, term 2. It is recommended that students do not commence work on these particular questions until the work has been covered in class.
- The questions have been grouped under syllabus headings to aid students in their preparation. The number in brackets after each question is its value in marks.

TASK DETAILS

Below are listed 12 questions. Any **two or three** of these questions will be asked in class. Students may not refer to any notes during this time. The time available will be 2 minutes per mark (eg if the 3 parts add to 22 marks, 44 minutes will be available).

How are priority areas for Australia's health identified?

1. Explain how the social justice principles are reflected by access to health care facilities and services. List the priority areas for improving Australia's health (7)
2. Using cardiovascular disease issues in Australia to highlight your answer, explain why "Prevalence of Condition" is a criteria for the identification of priority areas (5)
3. Explain the reasons for an increase in life expectancy of Australians (5)

What role does health promotion play in achieving better health for all Australians?

4. Complete the table by identifying, under each heading, one example of how the characteristics of the New Public Health Approach can be applied to a health promotion initiative. (3)

5. Analyse Cancer health promotion in Australia in terms of the Jakarta Declaration (8)

What role do health care facilities and services play in achieving better health for all Australians?

6. Discuss the reasons for the growth of alternative health care approaches whilst attempting to justify the ever increasing belief that Medicare should include coverage of the many alternative health care approaches. (15)
7. Assess the value of public and private health insurance for the Australian consumer, and critically analyse the inclusion of alternative medicine benefits in the majority of private health top cover packages today. (15)
8. Australians over the age of 65 years represent 12% of the Australian population and this will double over the next 20 years. Examine the impact of the aging population on the funding of health care in Australia. (8)

What actions are needed to address Australia's health priorities?

9. Identify a range of public policy developments aimed at addressing Cancer. Critically analyse the impact these policies have had on health in relation to this priority area. (10)
10. Analyse how building healthy public policy can address TWO national health priority areas you have studied (12)
11. Demonstrate how the Ottawa Charter action areas could be used to address the alarming increase in the incidence of Type 2 Diabetes in Australia. (12)
12. Assess the application of the Ottawa Charter action area Building Healthy Public Policy to a National Health Priority Areas you have studied. (8)
