

**Beach – Bush – Birds****.Dune Species**

Some of Long Reef beach dunes form part of a complete dune system relatively undisturbed. It is also an important habitat for birds especially the Superb Fairy Wren and many birds of prey such as kestrels and kites, who feed on the skinks and lizards who live in the dunes.
